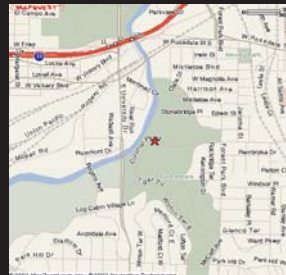

The nationally ranked Fort Worth Zoo is home to thousands of native and exotic animals. At many of the natural habitat exhibits, visitors are only separated from the animals by a river or a waterfall, and are often face-to-face with the animals through large viewing windows! When visiting the Zoo, don't forget, leave your pets and cigarettes at home!

The Fort Worth Zoo is a smoke-free environment. Coolers are prohibited on Zoo grounds. All other containers, bags, backpacks, etc. are subject to search.

## Exhibits

Below are just a few of the exhibits that you will see inside.



### Asian Falls

Carved out of an existing hillside, Asian Falls creates a dramatic setting that features some of the Zoo's most popular exhibits, including the Asian Elephant complex.

### Cheetos Cheetahs

This exhibit is divided into three areas, housing three African species - bongos, cheetahs and warthogs.

### Komodo Dragons

The 3,400 square foot, indoor-outdoor exhibit houses the endangered Komodo dragons and gharials, one of the largest crocodylian species.

### Meerkat Mounds

Visitors to Meerkat Mounds are able to observe the different roles each meerkat performs as it goes about its daily routine. Jobs include baby sitter, sentry, hunter and teacher.

### Herpetarium

Home to one of the largest reptile collections in the nation. Many of the species found here, such as the Philippine crocodiles and Jamaican Iguanas, are rare in zoological collections.

### Texas Wild!

This 8 acre exhibit dedicated to the Lone Star State's native flora and fauna houses over 200 native Texas animals.
